2. Project Summary and Objectives

The Project will construct a new two-lane road approximately 14.3 km long, in a key section of the East—West Highway that skirts the port city of Batumi. The Project objective is to improve regional connectivity and efficiency of road transport along the East-West Highway in Georgia. Total Project Cost: USD 315.2 million; USD 114.0 million (AIIB), EUR 108.2 (ADB), and USD 87.2 million (Govt. of Georgia)

The overall implementation is behind schedule initially due to delayed access to site, site conditions, and Contractor performance. The Contractor has made progress and has been requested to add work resources and improve work package management. The Contractor submitted in November a Claim for contract Extension of Time (EOT) to July 2021 which is under review by the Engineer. The Contractor will submit a revised work program once EOT is approved. ADB restructured its loan effective Oct. 2019 to apply the savings from the Project civil works contract to other transport projects in the Batumi region at the request of the Government. The ADB also extended its loan closing date to Dec. 2025, to accommodate the 5-yr performance-based maintenance contract.
