## 2. Project Summary and Objectives

The Project will construct a new two-lane road approximately 14.3 km long, in a key section of the East–West Highway that skirts the port city of Batumi. Total Project Cost: USD 315.2 million; USD 114.0 million (AIIB), EUR 108.2 (ADB), and USD 87.2 million (Govt. of Georgia).

The Project objective is to improve regional connectivity and efficiency of road transport along the East-West Highway in Georgia.

#### 5. Project Implementation Update

Batumi bypass road covers the section from Makhinjauri to riv. Chorokhi. Total length of the road is 14.325km while the width is 14.0m. The mentioned section flows through mountainous terrain and considers construction of 5 tunnels, 6 bridges, 7 viaducts, 9 overpasses, 57 culverts, and 4 interchanges. 3 out of the 5 tunnels within the project have been completed. Critical path for project completion lies in Tunnel #1 and Tunnel #2.

In 2022 there had been significant delay of commencing the civil works for both tunnels due to the financial difficulties of the contractor. The Extension of Time (EOT) to December 31, 2022, was granted as per Road Directorate (RD)'s request. In November 2022, the Contractor was able to mobilize limited funds to resume the construction. However, the progress in the construction of the Tunnels and Bridges is still slow in 2023, again due to the lack of funds by the Contractor and not enough Plant/Equipment and manpower available on the site to continue the Works towards completion in a timely manner. Another EOT is expected in 2023 but has not been granted as the Contractor has not provided a Program of Works to the Engineer for review after missing many deadlines for submission given by the Engineer.

As of end of June 2023, the value of executed works since commencement of the Project is 81.95% of the Contract Price (GEL 329,630,734.78). As per revised Cash Flow plan submitted by the Contractor in June 2022, the revised tentative contract price was indicated as GEL 367,903,168.39, and respectively, the cumulative physical progress from the revised tentative contract price is 73.43%.

On May 29, 2023, AIIB received the following request from the GMOF, which has legal implications to the Loan Agreement and triggers respective amendment procedure:

- A. To extend the Loan Closing Date from June 30, 2023 to December 31, 2025;
- B. To cancel the identified savings in the amount of USD15,000,000 in Item Number 1A (Batumi Bypass Road) of the "Allocation and Withdrawal of Loan Proceeds Table" in the Schedule 2, Section IV of the Loan Agreement;
- C. To reallocate USD5,000,000 from Item Number 1A (Batumi Bypass Road) to Item Number 2A (Construction Supervision of Batumi Bypass Road) of the "Allocation and Withdrawal of Loan Proceeds Table" in the Schedule 2, Section IV of the Loan Agreement; and
- D. To make necessary amendments to maintain consistency between AllB's Loan Agreement and ADB's Loan Agreement for the "Allocation and Withdrawal of Loan Proceeds Table" in the Schedule 2, Section IV and "Project Description" in Schedule 1 of the AllB Loan Agreement.

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On June 28, 2023, AllB sent a Consent Letter to the Ministry of Finance, giving no-objection to the request for loan closing date extension. AllB is now working with ADB, the lead financier on other proposed amendments to their respective Loan Agreements to ensure consistency.

#### **Financial Management:**

Bank team had received the Audit for FY 2022 on July 12, 2023 and provided comments on July 14, 2023.

#### 6. Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

The Local Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) was established on June 14, 2016, to receive written as well as verbal grievances. The GRM is functioning.

A total of 215 persons have submitted grievances across 11 categories to the GRC. Out of these, 167 grievances have been resolved as of June 31, 2023. Most people (85) applied for damage to their assets caused by construction activities, out of which 55 have been closed. 42 APs requested inclusion of their residential structures or land plots in the acquisition list, out of which 39 cases are closed. 28 APs expressed dissatisfaction due disturbance by noise/vibration and dust, out of which 15 cases closed.

In April 2023 no cases were resolved, 1 new grievance was received.

In May 2023 seven cases were resolved, 1 new grievance was received.

In June 2023 four cases were resolved, no new grievance was received.
