2. Project Summary and Objectives

The Project objective is to improve irrigation service delivery, strengthen flood risk management and improve climate change resilience in the project area. The main Project beneficiaries are farmer households, who will directly benefit from more reliable and efficient irrigation water supply and distribution and reduced flooding. This includes the 2.68 million people that will directly or indirectly benefit from the project.

5. Project Implementation Update

The overall project implementation remains on track, with substantial progress made in terms of procurement and fund disbursements. The Project disbursement ratio increased by 21% since the last reporting cycle. As of September 2023, about 86% of the loan proceeds have been awarded into contracts. Improvements are also observed in implementing irrigation works (Component B). Delays previously reported under this component have been addressed by descoping the poorly performing civil work contracts and retendering the descoped works. Flood management works (Component C) also proceed satisfactorily without major issues. Additional work on flood management could be needed under the Project. PIE is undertaking a comprehensive study on this, which may lead to an expansion of the project scope. This will be one of the key topics discussed at the upcoming implementation support mission (January 2024).

Financial Management:

There are no significant control deficiencies noted. As of October 2023, about 62% (USD 90.6 million) of the total loan was disbursed. There are no outstanding Interim unaudited Financial Reports (IUFRs) or audit reports. The audited project financial statements for the Financial Year (FY) 2021/2022 (ended on March 31, 2022) have been timely submitted and deemed acceptable by WB and AIIB. The next audited financial statement for FY 2022/2023 will become due December 31, 2023. The budgeted estimate for the Financial Year 2023-24 is INR 1016.00 crore (about USD 120 million), which is in sync with the Annual Work Plan. As decided during the Mid Term Review in April 2023, the proposal of utilizing the net exchange rate savings (after adjusting for the committed expenditure), amounting to INR 157 Crore (about USD 1.6 million), submitted in the form of 1st Revised Estimate to the State of West Bengal's Finance Department for approval.

6. Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

Grievance Redress Committees (GRC) have been formed in project-affected Grand Panchayats (GPs), the grievance registers are maintained at the site, and grievance boxes have been placed in all GPs. For Component B, 162 grievances have been received to date, of which 74 have been resolved. The remaining 68 are under consideration, mainly relating to communities' requests for rehabilitation of existing or construction of new culverts, outlets, inspection paths, and steps into canals. For Component C, 81 grievances have been received, of which 80 have been resolved. The grievances largely relate to a loss of access, dust, and noise during construction; as well as demands for culverts and repairs to roads. A grievance is resolved when it has been discussed with the GRC and PIE, and follow-up action has been agreed upon and subsequently completed.

7. Results Monitoring (please refer to the full RMF, which can be found on the last page of this PIMR)

The Monitoring and Evaluation consultant was fully mobilized in April 2023. It has submitted its inception report and reported the current achievement of the Intermediate Results Indicators (in which the targets of Intermediate Result Indicators #4 and #8 have been achieved). The achievement of the Project Objective Indicators will be reported before the next implementation support mission (January 2024).
