2. Project Summary and Objectives

The objective of the Program is to strengthen institutions and policies to increase access and improve rural sanitation services in selected governorates in the Arab Republic of Egypt. This will be accomplished through implementing key sector and institutional reforms together with rehabilitation and construction of integrated infrastructure for collection, treatment, and disposal of household sewage.

Phase 1 of the Program (SRSSP-1), financed by World Bank (WB), is under implementation in the three governorates of Beheira, Sharkia and Dakhlia. Phase 2 of the Program (SRSSP-2) is jointly co-financed by AIIB and the WB. Phase-2 are scaling-up sanitation services in the governorates of Sharkia and Dakhlia by including new villages and satellites,

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as well as include three new governorates of Menoufia, Gharbiya and Damietta. SRSSP has been prepared as a Program-for-Results (PforR) based development in accordance with the WB's PforR Policy. Under the PforR, the funds are released on achievement of results using Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLIs) and Disbursement Linked Results (DLRs). Key Results include: (i) Improved sanitation access; (ii) Improved operational systems and practices of Water Supply Companies (WSC); and (iii) Strengthened National Sector Framework.

AllB and WB are each contributing USD300 million to cover the total external financing of USD600 million needed to implement the SRSSP-2. AllB financing is for the physical infrastructure to provide sanitation services to about 178,000 households in 133 villages of five governorates; namely, Dakahliya, Sharkiya, Damietta, Menoufiya, and Gharbiya.

5. Project Implementation Update

All the consulting firms - including the Project Management Consulting Firm (PMCF-2) for the three new governorates of Menoufia, Gharbiya and Damietta, and the five Independent Supervision Consultants (ISCs) in each of the participating governorates – have been engaged and are providing services. The design/tendering related works has been divided into three batches, which are tendered out gradually. A total of 70 contracts, have been identified and 66 construction contracts have been awarded/executed. The construction contracts have been awarded for about 161,824 HH connections (for a program target of 178,317) in the five governorates. This represents satisfactory achievement of results under the agreed Disbursement Linked Result, DLR#1.5.1 and DLR#1.5.2.

Financial Management:

The program continues to maintain adequate financial management arrangement to ensure that reliable financial information is provided on program implementation. From the May 2022 mission, no major FM issues or internal control deficiencies were noted.

During the mission, it was agreed that the WB and AIIB would commence the deduction of the advance against DLIs as per the WB's disbursement guidelines applicable to PforR operations. To determine a specific commencement date for deduction of advances against the DLIs under the additional financed operation, which is co-financed with AIIB, the available cash balances will be reviewed after the investment plans from the WSCs are assessed and the first tranche of the transfers to the WSCs are completed by July 2022. Thereafter, the commencement date will be agreed on during the scheduled September 2022, technical mission.

The draft program audit report for the financial year ended June 30, 2021, was submitted on December 27th, 2021 to the WB for review and comments. Based on the comments provided, the PMU revised the report and submitted the finalized report on February 3rd, 2022. Although submitted after the original due date of December 31, 2021, the revised report was deemed to satisfactory as the auditors issued an unqualified (clean) opinion on the financial statements.

Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

The project GRM has been functioning well within the WSCs which receive regular O&M complaints as well as project level grievances.

The updated GRM mechanism will include arranging of the project level complaints and the required reports on the Central Management System. The updated version CMS system has been successfully implemented, tested and fully operationalized by all the WSCs. The GRM is available to the beneficiaries in the targeted governorates through multiple channels – (hotline/125, mobile application, e-mail, telephone of social specialists, WSC website and social media.) At the village level where construction is taking place, banners, leaflets and other public awareness materials are placed in different locations to inform the public about the GRM's multiple channels for registering complaints. PMU also conducted several training sessions for the front-line staffs in the WSCs and HCWW covering how to register, handle, and refer grievances related to the program for all villagers and clusters. The effectiveness of the GRM has been well-proven. During October 2021-March 2022, 90% of the total complaints (mostly under the WB funded parent program) were successfully addressed in less than 24 hours.
