# 2. Project Summary and Objectives

The project's objective is to strengthen the institutional and service delivery systems for Solid Waste Management (SWM) in Kerala.

The project will support the government to improve the SWM situation in Kerala by providing SWM infrastructure investments at both regional and municipal-levels. The project will support all 93 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) across 14 districts in Kerala in improving access to efficient and reliable delivery of SWM services to their populations.

The total project cost is USD300 million financed by AIIB and World Bank to the extent of USD105 million each and

the balance USD90 million is counterpart funds by the Government of Kerala (GoK). The project includes the following components:

Component A (USD110 million): Development of Regional SWM Facilities which will support construction, rehabilitation, closure and remediation of SWM facilities servicing a cluster of local bodies;

Component B (USD150 million): Improvement of SWM Infrastructure in Participating ULBs will improve local-level SWM service delivery systems by providing funds to the participating ULBs; and

Component C (USD40 million): Institutional Development, Capacity Building and Project Management Support which will provide technical assistance and capacity building at state and local levels.

The project's implementation period is from June 2021 to June 2027.


### 5. Project Implementation Update

Hiring of the Consulting firm for taking up feasibility studies under component A is progressing and is expected to be completed by May 2023. Under Component B, major activities for preparation of sub-projects in 90 ULBs such as District Planning Committee (DPC) approval as part of the Annual Development Plan (ADP) has been completed in the last six months. Project proposals aggregating to USD8 million have been prepared. The State Project Management Unit (SPMU) and the 14 District-level Project Management Units (DPMUs) are almost fully staffed with 15 and 70 staff positions respectively.

#### Financial Management:

The budget provision of USD13 million for FY 2022-23 (initially for Component B only) has now been reappropriated to all the components under the project. A new FM expert was deputed to the SPMU from the state finance department on November 1, 2022. Kerala State Audit Department (KSAD) has completed all ULB audits up to FY 2020-21. The IUFR for 1st half of the fiscal year 2022/23 (April 1 to September 30, 2022) was submitted to the WB and accepted by the WB. The copy of the report was shared with AIIB. The first project audit will be for the period from the loan signature date to March 31, 2023, and it will be due by September 30, 2023. Under the current financial arrangements of the project, the joint AIIB/World Bank co-financing funds of US\$300 million cannot be utilized to fund costs related to land acquisition/resettlement. Any land acquisition costs would need to be paid by GoK, in addition to the state share of US\$90 million.

SPMU has agreed to follow up on the following priority activities: (i) maintain adequacy and continuity of FM staffing at SPMU; (ii) utilization of the initial advance received from the WB and the AIIB based on the six-months' cash forecast; (iii) follow up on the adequacy of ULB staffing arrangements; (iv) continuous follow-up on the completion of the FY 2021-22 ULB audits by KSAD; (v) manage the first external audit of the project (for FY 2022-23) and submit the audit report on time; and (vi) obtain the relevant component wise budget provisions for FY 2023-24 from GoK. The implementation of these actions will be assessed during the upcoming mission in May 2023.

### Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

The Grievance Redress Mechanism has been established and requires a clear workflow for registration, action taken report, and closure of complaints after receiving feedback from the complainant, including the institutional mechanism with the escalation matrix.
